SECOND COUNCIL REPORT—FY 2017

GENERAL

The big news is that PCC Dave Parker has accepted the position of District 6-W Centennial Coordinator; a hearty welcome to PCC Dave! We now have all of our District Coordinator positions filled. As before, the current report provides a summary of Centennial Celebration programs and related activities, service activities reported by our Clubs for the past two years, travel by Amtrak to Chicago for the 2017 LCI convention, and Goals and Action Plans for the current year.

Each Club needs to appoint a Centennial Coordinator. District Coordinators will work through Zone Chairs to coordinate projects, activities, and reporting with Club Centennial Coordinators.

CENTENNIAL SERVICE CHALLENGE

LCI is asking clubs to lead through service during the Centennial Celebration. Encourage your clubs to host **at least one Centennial Service Challenge project** in each of our service areas of **youth, vision, hunger and the environment**. As of the end of September, Lions world-wide have served **112,393,776** people—exceeding our goal of serving at least 100 million people! At the USA/Canada Forum in Omaha this September, PIP J. Frank Moore III, Chairperson of the LCI Centennial Action Committee, suggested increasing the goal to 200,000,000 persons served through 2018! Remind your clubs to report their activities through the MyLCI Service Activity Report so they can receive a special Centennial banner patch.



YOUR CENTENNIAL DASHBOARD

The LCI **Centennial Dashboard** on MyLCI allows you to see your club's and district's participation by service activity to help you track the progress of your clubs. The Centennial Dashboard gives you real-time access to District and Multiple-District reports to help you quickly and efficiently monitor Centennial activities in your area. You will find the Centennial Dashboard in the list of reports available through MyLCI (this requires access to MyLCI). It's a great way to see which clubs and districts are on track and which need your support. The current Centennial Dashboard appears on the next page.

CENTENNIAL DASHBOARD-RESULTS

The Centennial Dashboard that appears below covers the first two years, plus the first quarter of the current year of the Centennial Celebration, which extends through June 30, 2018. Of note is the percentage of Clubs within the Multiple District that are reporting an average of 2 or more Centennial Service Campaigns per year; this amounts to an average of 31 percent of Clubs for the first quarter of the current year.

Also, note that the number of Centennial Community Legacy Projects “completed” within the Multiple District is relatively low. These sorts of projects are relatively broadly defined and are not necessarily designed to be completed within one year, depending upon the nature of the project. One of the objectives of the Centennial Community Legacy Projects is to provide one or more on-going community service projects that extend beyond the end of the Centennial Celebration. One example of “completion” of a community service project would be the installation of a Lions playground at a community park. As stated previously, FY 2018 is intended to be an “implementation year” for community service projects. See more below.



TRAVEL AMTRAK TO THE LIONS CENTENNIAL CONVENTION IN CHICAGO!

Thinking about attending the Lions Centennial Convention in Chicago in 2017? Why not join fellow Colorado Lions and travel by Amtrak?

PDG Lindel Silvertooth has been coordinating with Amtrak; he reports that we will meet in Fort Morgan and board the Amtrak's California Zephyr in the late afternoon on June 28, 2017, with arrival in Chicago the following afternoon at 2:50 PM. The round-trip cost may vary; an exact cost can be determined by contacting Amtrak. The senior fare has proven to be somewhat less than the group rate. Reservations are made individually, and a number of Lions have already made reservations. Should you need to cancel, you may do so, provided you notify Amtrak 24 hours prior to departure, at a full refund.

We must all board the train at the same location to get the group rate and to have seats together in the same car. Parking at the Fort Morgan Amtrak station is available but it is suggested that car pooling is a good idea. From the west you can pick up the California Zephyr in Grand Junction, Glenwood Springs, Granby, or Winter Park, but you purchase a ticket from your departure point to Fort Morgan and then another ticket at the group rate to Chicago. Fort Morgan has been chosen as the departure site due to security, good parking, and ease of access.

Travel to and from Chicago is as a group. However, you may leave on different days and still get the group rate. Just tell the Amtrak agent, when you make your reservation the date you wish to depart Chicago. The group plans to depart Chicago at noon on July 5.

The dates of the LCI Centennial Convention are June 30 to July 4, 2017. Registration forms and convention information should be available on-line or in the Lions magazine by late summer.

CENTENNIAL CELEBRATION GOALS AND ACTION PLANS

Goal I: Appoint a New District Centennial Coordinator in District 6-W

- A. *Facts and Circumstances:* The District 6-W Centennial Coordinator moved out of state in late May 2016 and needs to be replaced; this is the second District Centennial Coordinator within the MD to resign this year.
- B. *Responsible Party:* District Governor, District 6-W.
- C. *When:* Completed.

Goal II: Prepare District and Multiple District Centennial Plans

- A. *Facts and Circumstances:* LCI issued the “Budget Plan for Centennial District Coordinators” in early February. This form requires District Coordinators to set forth their plans in the areas of “Awareness Building, Lion Education, and Organization and Action” and submit them to the MD Centennial Coordinator for approval and development of the “Budget Plan for Multiple District & Single District Centennial Coordinators”. These plans are then to be forwarded to LCI for approval; upon approval, LCI will release funds in the amount of \$600.00 for the MD Centennial Coordinator and \$250.00 for each District Centennial Coordinator to be used for expenses (travel for Club visits and training, mailing, et al.)
- B. *Responsible Party:* District Centennial Coordinators, and then the MD-6 Centennial Coordinator, who will prepare the MD Centennial Plan based, in part, upon the District Plans.
- C. *When:* Completed.

Goal III: Conduct Training for District Centennial Coordinators

- A. *Facts and Circumstances:* The MD-6 Centennial Coordinator attended Area Centennial training in late January. LCI has also developed a training program for District Centennial Coordinators, and the MD-6 Centennial Coordinator has distributed the training materials to District Centennial Coordinators; no formal training at the District level has been conducted to date. Given the current availability of funds for travel, training will be either as a group, in person, or by electronic means (go-to-meeting).
- B. *Responsible Party:* MD-6 Centennial Coordinator.
- C. *When:* By December 1, 2016.

Goal IV: Continue Centennial Reporting Efforts

- A. *Facts and Circumstances:* LCI will implement the second of the Centennial reporting requirements (Report Days) in November, with reports due that month.
- B. *Responsible Party:* The District Centennial Coordinators will prepare their reports and submit them to the MD-6 Centennial Coordinator, who will then prepare a report for MD-6.
- C. *When:* By November 15, 2016.

CENTENNIAL CELEBRATION GOALS AND ACTION PLANS (CONTINUED)

Goal V: Support 2017 State Convention Planning Efforts

- A. *Facts and Circumstances*: Planning for the 2017 State Convention is a separate, but related, effort from the Centennial Coordination effort. On-going coordination of Centennial Celebration plans with the 2017 State Convention planning efforts is needed.
- B. *Responsible Party*: District and MD-6 Centennial Coordinators, along with the 2017 State convention planning committee.
- C. *When*: On-going.

Goal VI: Communicate with Clubs Regarding the Centennial Celebration

- A. *Facts and Circumstances*: Most of the activities and programs that are a part of the Centennial Celebration are done by the Clubs, to include reporting of their activities. For example, as shown on Page 2 of this Council Report (Centennial Dashboard), many Clubs in the MD are not reporting their service activities on MyLCI in accordance with Centennial reporting guidance.
- B. *Responsible Party*: Communication with Clubs, with the assistance of the District Governor's team, including Zone Chairs, is a key function of the District Centennial Coordinators. The MD-6 Centennial Coordinator is responsible for communicating LCI guidance to the Council and District Centennial Coordinators and reporting to LCI.
- C. *When*: On-going.
