Each district has a different set of things to accomplish this year.

North East:

The west district has a problem of clubs agreeing to be a sponsoring club. They all have membership problems and want to work on their problems rather than taking on the district membership problem. It is true growth in a club helps the district and the club. A new club helps the district and places a burden on the sponsoring club.

The areas to be worked for new clubs are a great distance from the willing sponsoring clubs.

The multiple will finish the Lions year with three of the districts on the positive side but by a small amount as to where we need to be.
